By the Gov<sup>rno:</sup>

Whereas I formerly promised to Henry Hastings and Richard Buffington a convenient tract of land for a settlement for them, And whereas ye said Henry & Richard have pitched upon & made thysobl of a Parcell of land neare Markus Hooke in ye Province aforesaid. And have made their application to me that they may have liberty to sett upon flower hundred akers of the said land. These are therefore(obl) signys to all whom it may concerne. That I do hereby grant Lysbl & allowe the said Henry Hastings & Richard Buffington to take up seat & enjoy the said flower hundred Akers of land, for which they have agreed & do hereby agree to pay tennie pounds in good m<sup>t</sup>charitable Boards at flower pounds of thousand at or before the last day of August next ensuing ye date hereof, And alsoe to pay twelve pounds yearly for each & every hundred akers for ye quittrent for ye same p<sup>r</sup>misses unto William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> (ye Proprietor of ye said Province his Heires & assignes or his or their commiss<sup>r</sup> Agents or serv<sup>r</sup>s at such tymes & places as by him or them shall bee required. Given under my hand & scale at Upland the eighteenth day of Aprill Anno D<sup>r</sup> 1682. / W<sup>r</sup> Markham.
