By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Joseph Hains of Nottingham that we would grant him to take up one hundred acres of land in Chester County for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use Ten pounds and the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling for the same. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Joseph Hains according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of one hundred acres of land that has not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a return thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the said Joseph fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 17th day of the ninth month Anno Domini 1715.
