By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Jacob Hochstater now of the Township of Strasburg in this Province that we would grant him to take up in or near the sd township the quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use five and twenty pounds money of the said Province on or before the five and twentieth day of March next ensuing the date hereof for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling for each hundred acres and in proportion for the fifty acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Jacob Hochstater in or near the place aforesaid according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of land that has not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office. Which survey in case the said Jacob fulfill the above agreement shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seal of ye Province at Philad^{ia} 18th of 12th moth A.D. 1717/8.
