

At the request of Capt Samuel Ffinney. That I would grant him to take up the Overplus land of the township of Taocorinck contiguous to the land late of Jacob Hall reputed to be about one hundred acres. These are to require thoe forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the sd Capt Ffinney the sd Overplus land of Taocorinck reputed to contain one hundred acres be it more or less, and make returns thereof into my secretaries office. Given under my hand and seal at Philadelphia the 22d of ye 7<sup>mo</sup> 1701.
