At the Request of Thomas Green of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land in this Province for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use fifty Pounds and the usual yearly Quittrent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to to survey or cause to be surveyed to the said Thomas Green according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred acres of land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a returne thereof into the Secretary's Office in order to a further Confirmation which survey in case the said Thomas fulfil the above agreement within three months after Location shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted given under our hands & seal of the Province at Philadelphia the fifteenth day of the seventh Month A.D. 1714.
