

By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property to me directed dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the 5<sup>mo</sup> 1705.. I do hereby certify that I have survey'd unto Samuel Carpenter Anthony Morris and others for the use of the meeting of Friends in Philadelphia the front and high street lots belonging to the original purchase of twelve hundred and fifty acres of land made by George Fox said to be bequeathed by the said George the use aforesaid.

The said front lot bounded on east with the ~~one~~ front street on the south with Wm Taylors lot on the west with second street and on the north with Richard Thomas his lot Being in Breadth twenty five foot and a half and in length ~~one~~ hundred and one feet ————— The High street lot situate between the third and fourth streets bounded on the north with the said High street and on the east with a vacant lot on the south with the backs of Chestnut street lots and on the west with Thomas Barkers lot survey'd and laid out this last day of the fifth month 1705.
