At the request of Mary Fletcher Widow That I would grant her a resurvey on
a certain tract of land whereon she is seated, situate in Oxford township
in the County of Philadelphia reputed to contain two hundred fifteen acres
and a half $11\frac{1}{2}$ acres, ^{ye of} bought in a tract of 300 acres of Thomas Daquet and
104 acres of Robt Adams: These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey or cause
to be resurvey'd the said tract according to its first lines of survey, and make
return thereof into my secretaries office. Given under my hand and seal at
Philadelphia the 30th of the first month 1700,
