

Resurvey'd the first of the eleventh month 170<sup>5/6</sup> unto Thomas ffairman a piece of land in the township of Oxford in the county of Philadelphia beginning at a post by Tagony Creek and running from thence by the land of Jno Worrall south west one hundred and forty two Pches. <sup>to a post</sup> Thence south east by other land of the said Tho ffairman ninety two Pches to a post by the said Tagony Creek Then by the said creek north 37 deg. east twenty seven perches north four degrees east fifty two perches then north 30 perches then fifteen degrees east thirty nine perches then north eleven degrees east twenty seven perches then north eleven degrees east twenty seven perches to the place of the Beginning containing forty three ~~acres~~ acres. Return'd into the General Surveyors office the 29<sup>th</sup> of the month and year aforesaid. Certified in the said office date this Patent ye 23 febry.
