By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of Thomas Fairman. That we would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land further in right of Thomas Harley's original purchase of five thousand acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyd to the said Thomas according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred acres of land in this Province that has not been already surveyd nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 28th day of the third month (called May) in the Seventh year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lady Queen Anne over ~~Great~~ Great Britain &c. Annoq Dom 1708.
