


Pursuant to a warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Property and the seal of the Province bearing date the 14th day of the 2^d month 1702 Granting unto James Wallis (at the request of his attorney Thomas Withers) a survey on five hundred acres of land in right of the said Wallis his purchase of one thousand acres. There is survey'd and laid out unto James Wallis five hundred acres of land situuate on the north side of Brandywine Creek Beginning at a Hickory tree at the corner of John Baldwin's land from thence extending by the said land south two hundred seventy seven perches to a ~~corner~~ post. Thence west by vacant land two hundred eighty nine perches to corner black oak from thence north by the lands of Joseph Kirl Jeremiah Collet and Robert Vernon two hundred seventy seven perches to a Hickory tree from thence east by Peter Taylors land two hundred eighty nine perches to the place of the beginning survey'd by Isaac Taylor the 7th day of 9^{br} 1702.
