

Granted Samuel Finney

2<sup>d</sup> 8ber. 1701. Beginning at a black oak sapling standing by a small branch of  
 patent Taconiumk Creek at the corner of other land of the said Sam-  
 uel Finney from thence by the severall Courses of the said  
 branch Two hundred sixty eight perches to ye Maine Creek from thence  
 by the severall Courses thereof Seventy eight perches to the marsh be-  
 longing to the said land From thence by the Severall Courses dividing  
 between the said Marsh and the East land two hundred eighty one  
 perches from thence by the said creek one hundred and thirty perches to  
 a stake from thence by the sd Samuel Finneys other land north northwest one  
 hundred ninty ffoure perches to the place of Beginning, containing two hundred sixty  
 seven acres. Also the Meadows, Marshes, Swamps, Gripes, Savannahs, and pas-  
 tures that lye as well within the lines of the said two hundred sixty seven  
 acres of land as between the said lines <sup>and the</sup> River and Creek aforesaid.
