

March 1713.

By virtue of the Commissioners warrant dated the 20th of the 8th mo. 1712 I do certify that there was surveyed unto Thomas Fairman two hundred acres of land in the county of Philadelphia beginning at a corner post of Peter Wentz's land thence northeast by the upper line of Bristol township one hundred perches unto a corner post of land belonging to John Welsh three hundred and twenty perches thence northwest by the same ~~thence~~ to another post for a corner thence southwest by vacant land one hundred perches to a white oak sapling marked for a corner thence southeast by the said Wentz's land three hundred and twenty perches to the first mentioned corner post containing two hundred acres of land and is accordingly returned into the surveyor General's office at Philadelphia ye 26 of the first month March 1713.
