By ord^E and direction from ye Capt W^{II} Markham Deputy Govern^E and Comm^E for setting out lands to Purchasers and Planters in Pennsilvania, bearing date ye 7th of ye 6th mo. 82. Directed to me I hereby certifie into ye Proprietary and Govern^E Secretarys office yt I have caused to be surveyed and set out ye 28th of ye said mo. unto Josuah Stearn in part of his Purchas of in pt therof five hundred acres, two hundred and fifty acres of land in ye County of Chester, Begirning at a corne marked Gum tree standing by muckrulon Creek being ye corne marked tree of Luke Harick from thence E.N.E by ye said Haricks line of marked trees 580 perches to a corne marked white oak, from thence N.S.W. by a line of marked trees 64 perches to a corne marked white oak from thence N.S.W. by a line of marked trees 680 perches to a corne marked white oak standing by ye said creek from thence by ye greek side on severall Courses to ye ffirst mentioned Gum tree and is accordingly entred and recorded in my office Philadelphia this 18th of ye 5th moneth 1684.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twentieth day of August 1909.
