By vertue of two war<sup>t</sup>s ffrom ye Com<sup>r</sup>ss ye one dated ye 7<sup>th</sup> of ye 2d m<sup>o</sup> 1685  
 ye other dated ye 2d of ye flowerth<sup>t</sup> moneth<sup>t</sup> 1685 directed to ye Survey<sup>r</sup> Generall  
 I do by authority ffrom him certifie into ye Secretarys office that there was  
 Surveyed and laid out ye 11<sup>th</sup> of ye 7<sup>th</sup> m<sup>o</sup> 1685 unto Mary ffircher, (The  
 Relict of ffrauncis ffircher) nine hundred sixty five acres of land in ye  
 County of Chester (ffour hundred and ninety acres whereof is in right of  
 Alexander Beardsly Purchas<sup>r</sup> and ye remaining ffour hundred severity and  
 five acres is ye remained<sup>r</sup> of her late Husbands Purchass). Beginning at a  
 corn<sup>r</sup> hickory tree thence running N. N. W. by Richard Sneed's land six hund-  
 dred and ffourty perches, thence W. S. W. by a line of trees two hundred ffourty two  
 perches to a corn<sup>r</sup> marked red oak, thence S. S. E. by a line of trees six hund-  
 dred and ffourty two perches to ye place of begining, which is accordingly or-  
 tred & recorded in ye Survey<sup>r</sup> Generalls office at Philadelphia ye 23<sup>d</sup> 2<sup>m</sup> 1692.
