By the Commission^{ee} of Property.

Whereas by our warrt: dated 21st of the last month directed to thee we granted to John Guest Esq to take up three hundred and thirty three acres and one third of an acre of land in the County of Chester beyond Marlborow in the road to Otteraroe under the yearly rent of two bushels of winter wheat for every hundred acres and so proportionably to be added to another parcel of land containing six hundred & sixty six acres and two thirds of an acre of purchased land ordered to be laid out in ye^e sd place, & compleating in ye^e whole one thousand acres: And whereas the sd John Guest hath since applied to us complaining that the sd quantity is not sufficient encouragement^t to make his design'd settlem^t & therefore requests that we would grant the sd land on an easier rent and make such a ~~suitable~~ addition by a further grant as we shall think reasonable for his encouragert: We therefore taking his said request into consideration have for good & weighty reasons ordered & doe hereby ord^e and require thee to survey and lay out to the sd John Guest Esq five hundred and thirty three acres and one third of an acre of land in the aforesaid place beyond all former surveys & about midway between his other settlem^t in Newcastle County & those of Nottingham where not already survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians, including our former grant of 333 1/3 acres & compleating his whole land in the sd place twelve hundred acres, the sd land to be held under the yearly rent of one bushel of wheat & Ann^t ~~for~~ for every hundred acres & so proportionably & to be duly improved & seated with good settlem^t thereon before the first of December 1704 otherwise this grant to be void and make returns into ye^e Surveyor Gen^l's office by a copy hereof certified by ye Secry^r Given at Philadelphia 20th May 1703. ^{Thos.
