That is to say one lot on the front street on Delaware of one hundred and two feet & one in the second street & another in the third each behind the other & of the same dimensions. Also one front Lot, one in the second & one in the third on Skuykill in the same manner, & of equal Dimensions, with the former and make returns into the General Surveyors office at Philadelphia, where this warrt is to remain and a copy thereof to be delv'd to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 20th of the 12th moth 1704.
