

Pursuant to a warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governor to me directed bearing date the 4th day of the 1st month 1709.

I do hereby certify that I have caused to be resurveyed unto Walter Fauclitt a certain tract of land whereon he is now seated reputed to contain two hundred acres beginning at a post standing by Ridley Creek, from thence running by the land of John Sharpless north twenty one degrees east four hundred thirty four perches to an oak standing by Grum Creek from thence by the several Courses of the said Creek the several distances on the said several Courses amounting in all to two hundred thirty and four perches to a black oak standing on a rock by the said Creek side from thence south thirty one degrees west by a line of marked trees two hundred and twenty five perches to the said Walter Fauclitt's fence from thence by the same south twenty five degrees east sixteen perches to Ridley Creek from thence by the several Courses of the said creek the several distances on the said several Courses in all amounting to one hundred thirteen perches and a half to the place of beginning containing as above two hundred acres. The said tract being situated in the township of Ridley County of Chester was resurveyed the 21st day of the 1st month 1709, and returned according to the abovesaid survey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governor's Secretary's office the 20th day of the 7th month 1709.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twentieth day of August 1909.
