At the request of George Fitzwater of the City of Philadelphia that we would grant him to take up within the said city the Front lot belonging to the original purchase of Five thousand acres of land made of the <sup>late</sup> Prop<sup>t</sup> by Thomas Harley of Kinsgham Court in the County of Hereford Esq<sup>r</sup> as also the front lot appurtenant and belonging to Eleven hundred acres purchased of the said Prop<sup>t</sup> by Allen Foster and likewise the lots appertaining to one thousand acres purchased in like manner by Henry Pawlin, the right to which several lots of ground by Sundry mesne conveyances being now vested in the said George Fitzwater. These are to authorize and require the to survey and lay out or cause to be surveyed and laid out unto the said George Fitzwater the said lots of ground where the same fall by allotment or as near thereunto as ground may be found vacant and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office in order for further confirmation. Given under our hands and lesser seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of the 9<sup>th</sup> month Anno Dom<sup>i</sup> 1787.
