

Whereas the Commissioners of Property by their warrant to me directed bearing date the 23^d day of the 4th Month A.D. 1727. Required me to survey unto George Fitzwater of Philadel^a the front lot in the said City belonging to the original Purchase of five thousand acres of land made by Thomas Harley of Kingsharr^t ^{Court in the} County of Hereford Esquire as also the front lot appurtenant and belonging to eleven hundred acres purchased by Allen Foster where the said lots of Ground fell by allotment or as near thereunto as ground might be found. This may certify that on the 12th day of September in the year 1727 I surveyed and laid out for the said George Fitzwater one lot or piece of ground in the said City Bounded eastward with Delaware Front Street Southward with James Steels lot Westward with the second Street and on the north with another lot of the said George Fitzwater being in breadth thirty two feet and in Length three hundred ninety six feet, surveyed also the same day to the said George Fitzwater in lieu of the Remainder a piece of ground in the said City lying between the fifth and sixth Streets from Delaware Bounded on the north with the High Street eastward with Widow Britair's Lot southward with Chestnut Street Lots and on ye west with Thomas Mayleight's lot being in breadth one hundred and twenty foot and in Length three hundred & six feet.
