

Pennsilvania.

By virtue of an assignment made over in the court at Upland the 25<sup>th</sup> of ye 9<sup>th</sup> mo. 1677 from James Sanderlin and Lawrence Cook to Walter John & Francis Forrest, four hundred and seventeen acres of land situated & being on ye northeast side of Polquessinok Creek, & surveyed unto them ye 8<sup>th</sup> of ye 8<sup>th</sup> mo. 1678, & since by virtue of a warrant from the Proprietary & Government dated ye 21<sup>st</sup> of ye 12<sup>th</sup> mo. 1683. Directed to me, I hereby certify into his Secretary's office, yt I have caused to be resurveyed ~~unto~~ thern ye sd land begining at a corner marked pine tree, standing on Delaware River, from thence down ye severall courses of ye sd River to ye mouth of Polquessinok Creek & up ye severall courses of ye sd Creek to a corner marked (o. p. l.) from thence E 63 1/4 N. by the land of John Gilbert 235 perches to a corner marked oak, from thence S. S. E. by ye land of John East 200 perches to ye first mentioned pine tree, and is accordingly Entered & Recorded in my office, Philadelphia this 12<sup>th</sup> of ye 5<sup>th</sup> mo. 1684.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty-seventh day of August 1909.
