


Reasurveyd 13th 9th mo. 1702.



Pursuant to an order from the Proprietors Commiss^{rs} of Prop^{ty} in a warrant directed to Edward Pennington then Survey^r Generall bearing date the 20 of ye first mo. 1709 I do certify that I have reasurveyd unto Mary fflecher a certaine tract of Land in Oxford township in ye County of Philadelphia begining at stak now a whitte ~~ok~~ marked in a line of Joseph Astors land being a corner of Attwell Willmers land from thence by a street or road deviding it from ye said Willmers land southwest 253 perches to a stak neare a stone deviding it from ye same land thence southeast 56 perches to ye line of ye reputed land of Tho. Seres thence by the same land southwest 275 perches to stak thence west by a line of marked trees 74 perches to a branch of Tacory Creek thence by the Serrall^s Courses as: N: 65, E: 6: N: 26 E: 12: E: 20 S: 3: N 20 E 5 3/4 thence N. W. 48 perches to a stak set in the ground from thence by a line of marked trees deviding it from Robert Adames and Joseph ~~Pauls~~ Pauls land 558 perches to a stak set in ye ground from thence by a line of marked trees southeast 46 p^r to ye place of begining containeing 265 acres of land and is according to ye bounds above described Returned into ye Generall Survey^rs office at Philadelphia ye 14th day of ye 9th mo. 1702.
