Whereas the late Commissioners by their warrt bearing date ye 24th of the 5th Month 1708 granted to William Garret to take up in this Province forty two acres of land that had not been survey'd nor seated by the Indians, in right and as the full remaind^r of an original Purchase of two hundred and fifty acres made of the Proprietor by William Neale, who convey'd the same to the said Will^m Garret w^{ch} warrt has never hitherto been legally executed and whereas the said William hath requested of us that the said land may be taken ~~out~~ out of that late vacant tract in Willis Town in the County of Chester ~~not~~ on part whereof the Indians are seated, and that he may be admittted to take up so much more in the same place as may make up one hundred acres in ye whole, for which he agrees to pay forthwith after survey to the Proprietors usg. Twelve pounds for the fifty eight acres to be now granted and the Privilege aforesd. These therefore are to authorize thoe to survey or cause to be survey'd to the sd William Garret the said quantity of one hundred acres of land out of the aforesaid tract joyning on the one side on his son Thomas Garrets land & on ye tract laid out to ye Indians on the other, and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office Which survey in case the sd William fulfill ye agreem^t aforesd shall be valid, otherwise

ye same shall be utterly void & of no effect. Given under our hands & seal of the Province
at Philad^{le} on the 16th day of Septemb^r A. D. 1713.
