Whereas for certain considerations We thought fitt by our warrt bearing date the 20th of the 5th Moth last past to grant unto John Guest Esq the quantity of five hundred and some odd acres of land to be laid out in a certain place expressed in the said warrt where no vacant land is now to be found, by which the intention of the said grant is likely to become frustrated, for prevention of which These are at the repeated Instances and request of the said John Guest to survey and lay out to him the quantity of five hundred acres of land in lieu of our set former grant, in the County of Chester where it has not been already surveyed nor taken up nor is concealed nor scated by the Indians, but regularly situated beyond (obl)adjacent to the present outer most surveys to be held under the yearly Quittent of one Bushel of wheat for every hundred acres, and make returns thereof into the General surveyors office at Philad to where this warrt is to remain and a copy thereof to be delived to thee certified by the Secretary.
