

By virtue of a warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Property
and the seal of the Province dated the 16th of the 12th month 1701.

Surveyd unto Henry Hollingsworth a certain tract of Barrens, situate
in the county of Chester. Beginning at ^a corner stake by Ridley creek and from
thence extending by the sd creek following the several courses of the same one
hundred seventy nine perches to an old corner dog-tree by the creek side the (obl.)
leaving the said creek and running south sixty five degrees wester one hund-
red and two perches to an old corner marked white oak standing by Dismal
run. Then up the said run after the several courses thereof four hundred forty one
perches to a dead walnut tree standing the said run from thence by David
Ogden's land south thirty eight degrees easterly fifty four perches to an old corner
Black oak at the corner of George Simoddy's land. Then by the said land north fifty
seven degrees easterly four hundred eighty two perches to the place of the Beginning
containing three hundred and twenty seven acres. Surveyd by Geo. Dakeyne ye
