## By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Philip Howel. That we would grant him a survey on seven hundred acres of land in the Welch tract, part of wh<sup>t</sup> hath been already surveyd and was by him purchased of Rich<sup>d</sup> Thomas being part of the sd Rich<sup>d</sup>s ffeathers original purchase of 5000 acres: These are to require thee to resurvey to the sd Philip Howel, so much of the sd land as has already been laid out, and to survey and lay out to the sd Philip the complemt that shall appear upon thy sd resurvey to be wanting of the sd quantity of 700 acres of land in the sd Welch tract where not already surveyd nor taken up and make returns into the General Surveyors office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delv<sup>d</sup> to thee certified by ye Secretary. Given under our hands and ye seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 9<sup>th</sup> day of 9<sup>th</sup> 1702.
