

Pursuant to a warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governor bearing date the 17th day of third month 1700 Granting one hundred acres of land to be surveyd unto William Parlet late of the Isle of Wight at the yearly Rent of one penny sterl^l per acre And by virtue of a Particular Order from the sd Proprietary dated the 17th of the 8th month 1701 ordering the said warrant to be executed on the Land where the said Parlet is seated on near Right^s-Town in the County of Bucks

There is Resurveyd unto William Parlet a Piece of land in # Rightstown in the County of Bucks beginning at a corner marked white oak in the line of Samuel Bakers land from thence extending by the said land north east one hundred and twenty perches to a corner black oak from thence north east by Andrew Heath's land one hundred and ninety two perches to a corner post from thence south west one hundred and twenty perches to a corner Hickory tree Thence Southeast by William Derricks land one hundred and nine two perches to the place of beginning Containing one forty four acres Resurveyd by ~~the Surveyor~~ the 14th of 11th mo 1701 Certified under the hand of Phineas Pemberton Surv^r of Bucks Co.
