



Pursuant to a warrant to me directed by Edward Penington Surveyor Generl
 dated 1 day of the 2 month 1701 to resurvey unto John Rowland two Tracts of Land scituate
 in the County of Bucks wh said Tracts are contiguous and Beging at a corn^t post being
 a corn^t of Edmnd Lovet's Land thence south east by east one hundreded ninety three
 perches to a red oake Then by Edward Wantons Land south forty seven degrs west forty
 two perches Then by said Wantons Land south south east Two hundreded forty seven perches
 to a post and a bl. oake marked neare by for a corn^t Then by Phineas Pemberton's
 land west south west sixty four perches to a post and a smal hickery in a swamp
 marked for a corn^t Then by Daniel Smith's Land north north west one hundreded ninety
 two perches to a small maple Then by Charles Leverally's Land north west by west
 one hundreded ninety two perches to a Spanish oak Then by John headleys Land north thirty six degs
 east forty five perches to a post Then north Twenty five degrs west to a maple in a creek Ten perches
 Then by the Courses of the Creek as layd down in the figure hereunto annexed including the Creek in

the said Rowlands Land to a post Then still continuing by said Headleys Land north forty three degs east
 fifty two perches to the place of Beginning Containing Two hundreded thirty nine acres Resurveyed & Certified the 31 day of the 1 month 1701 P
 Phineas Pemberton
