William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Governour in Chief
of the Province of Pensilvania and Countys annexed

At the Request of John Rowland That I would grant him a Resurvey
on a certain Tract of Land in the County of Bucks reputed to contain 100
Acres being part of a Tract of 300 Acres granted by my Warrant and con-
firmed by my Comm^{rs} by Patent to Thomas Bowman in right and as part of
ye 5^d Bowman's Original purchase of 5000 Acres, by whom it was convey'd to
Sam^l Richardson, by him to Ph^l Pemberton ~~and by him~~ who convey'd the 5^d
100 Acres to the 5^d Rowland, and is now in his Possession. Also that I would
grant him a Re-survey on another Tract in the 5^d County reputed to contain one
hundred and tenn Acres laid out with another Tract by warr^t from myself
to Ralph Smith, whose Exec^r Ja^s Harrison convey'd it to Edw^d Stanton, whose
Adm^r Amy Read convey'd it to Tho^s Rogers who sold it to Edm^d Lovett who
convey'd it to 5^d Rowland. These are to require thee forthwith to Re-survey or
cause to be re-survey'd the two said Tracts according to their first bounds
and Lines of Survey, and make Returns y^e of into my Secretaries Office.
