


FORM No. 1.



By virtue of a Warr<sup>t</sup> from the Proprietor bearing date the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> month 1701, Surveyed & laid out unto the Assigns of William Penington a tract of Land in Plumstead township in the County of Bucks Begining at a Post by a white oak sixteen perches South West from Francis Plumstead's Corner, from thence extending North West by vacant & Jeremiah Langhorn's Land four hundred thirty two perches to a heap of stones, Then by vacant Land North East one hundred eighty five perches & an half <sup>perch</sup> to a white oak, Then South East by vacant Land four hundred thirty two perches to a Post between a small white oak & a Hickory in the s<sup>d</sup> Plumstead's Line, Then by the s<sup>d</sup> Line South West one hundred eighty five perches & an half perch to the place of begining Containing five hundred acres Surveyed the 10<sup>th</sup> of the 6<sup>th</sup> month 1716 This Tract of Land is now in possession By me John Cutler of Sarah Stevenson & Joseph Kirkbride Dep<sup>t</sup> Survey<sup>r</sup>

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this Twenty-fifth day of March 1909
