

By virtue of two Warrants from Jacob Taylor Survey: Gen<sup>r</sup>: to me directed bearing date the 18<sup>th</sup> day of June Ano: Dom: 1714 Surveyed & Laid out unto Thomas Stevenson in right of George White & Isaac Decon a tract of Land in Plumstead Township in Bucks County Beginning at a Post at the corner of the Land laid out to Elizabeth Sands for the use of the Heires of her first Husband Thomas Norcross, from thence running by the S<sup>d</sup> Land North West five hundred & thirty perches to a Post, Then North East by Vacant Land one hundred & sixty perches to another Post, Then by Vacant Land South East five hundred & thirty perches to a Stump of a dead tree, Then South West by Land laid out to Widow Musgrove one hundred & sixty perches to the place of begining Containing five hundred acres with allowance for Roads according Law, Given under my hand the third day of August Anno Domini 1714.
