

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary
and Goverour to me directed bearing date the 5th day of the 4th month 1700 do hereby
certify that I have caused to be surveyed unto Peter Worral in right of John
Alsop old purchaser a certain Tract of Land situate in the County of Bucks, be-
ginning at a marked white oak being the corner of ye Land laid out to Mercy
Phillips, from thence by the Land of Richard Tucker and William Gibson North West
one hundred seventy and two perches to a heap of stones ~~set~~ sett up for a corner,
from thence by vacant Land North East three hundred seventy two perches
and a half to a corner post, from thence South East by vacant Land one hundred
seventy and two perches to another corner post, from thence by vacant Land
and the Land of Mercy Phillips South West three hundred seventy two perches
and a half to the first mentioned white oak Containing four hundred acres and
seventy perches. Returned according to the abovesaid survey and bounds (which
said survey was performed the 6th day of the 3^d month 1701) into the Proprietary
and Goverour's Secretary's Office the 23rd day of the 4th month 1701
