

Acres in part of the said purchase These are to Authorize & Require thee  
to Survey and lay out to the sd ffrancis Plumstead according to the Method  
of Townships appointed the sd quantity of five Hundred Acres of Land  
in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is  
concealed nor seated by the Indians and make Returns into the General  
Surveyor's Office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warrt is to remain and a copy thereof  
to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary Given under our hands and  
the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 21<sup>st</sup> of the 4<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1703
