



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries's Comms. to me directed bearing date the first day of the ninth month 1703 to lay out unto Jeremiah Langhorne 250 acres of Land in Bucks County in right of George White Original purchaser of 2500 acres. Surveyed and laid out unto the said Jeremiah Langhorne a tract of Land in Soulberry township in Bucks County. Beginning at Chestnut tree by the River Delaware being a Corner of Henry Paxson's land, Thence by the said Paxson's line South East one hundred twenty nine perches to a Post. Then by William Croasdale's land South West two hundred thirty three and an half perches to a Post by a White Oak at Francis White's Corner Then by the said White's Land North West one hundred and Eighty perches to a Post. Then by vacant Land North East one hundred forty six perches to a Pine tree by the said River Then down the several courses thereof to the place of beginning Containing 250 acres. Certified under my hand this 18th 10th mo 1703.
