

Resurveyed the 21st. day of the 12th. Month 1701 by virtue of a warrant from the Governor dated the 30th. day of the 9th. Month 1700 unto Richard Hough 475 Acres in Makefield Township in the County of Bucks Beginning at a corner marked white oake at Andrew Elliott's corner, Thence by Thomas Kirles land west 42 perches to a Post, Then by Palmer's South 200 perches to a Post. Then west 32 perches to a black oak at White's corner, Then by the said White's land south 273 perches to a great white oak at Lucas's corner. Then East 7 deg. 5 by the said Lucas's land 292 perches to a heap of stones, Then North by Geedall's and Margerum's 128 perches to a heap of stones, Then by Parsons's land west 70 perches to a heap of stones. Then North by the same 62 perches to a heap of stones neare a Maple - Then by Snowden's line w. 2 deg. N. 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ perches to a great white oake. Then by the same North 60 perches to a corner marked black oake, Then by Venables west 43 perches to a black oake, Then North by the same 131 perches to a Post. Then west by Margerum 59 $\frac{1}{2}$ perches to a small black oake, Then by the said Margerum and Elliott's land North 117 $\frac{1}{2}$ perches to the place of beginning, given under my hand.
