Governr: and Comrs: &c. Bearing date ye 12th. of ye 8th moneth
1682. Directed to me I hereby certifie into ye Proprietrs and
Governrs. Secretarys office yt I have caused to be Surveyed
and Laid out ye — of ye — mo unto Cuthbert Hurst P: A Certain
peece or percill of Land Situate Lying and being in ye County
of Bucks and on ye East Side of Neshamennah Creek Begining
at a Cornr: marked tree. Standing by ye said Creek from
thence South East five degrs. Southerly by ye Land of Rich-
ard — 60 perches thence E 6 degrs Southerly by ye said Land
80 perches from thence E.S.E. by a Line of marked trees two
hundred perches from thence East ten^o degrs. northerly by a Line
of marked trees four hundred sixty and two perches from thence
north ten degrs. to ye Westward by a Line of marked trees fifty
perches to a Cornr: post from thence West ten degrs Southerly
by ye Land belonging to James Delworth four hundred sixty
and Eight perches from thence West north west by ye said
Delworths Land one hundred and Eighty perches to a cornr:
marked tree Standing by ye aforementioned Creek from thence
down ye several Courses thereof to ye first mentioned Cornr:
tree Containing and Laid out as above fore two hundred and
fifty acres of Land And is accordingly Entred and Recorded
in my office Philadelphia this 8th day of ye second month
1685.
