

By virtue of a General Warrant from the Commissrs of Property dated the 5th day of the 11th month 1702 for Resurveying of lands in the County of Bucks directed to John Cutler Surveyor of the said County. There is Resurvey'd unto Robert Heaton one hundred Acres of land with a parcel of vacancy which together with the overplus of the said hundred Acres contains one hundred fifty eight Acres Also two hundred and sixty six Acres Laid out for to hundred and fifty Acres to Alexander Gyles and convey'd by Mary Lover and Dorothy Gyles Daughter and Heirs of the said Alexander to the said Robert Heaton Also two hundred and eighty Acres Granted by Patent to Robert Holdgate and by him Convey'd to the said Robert Heaton. The whole containing eight hundred and eighteen Acres. The whole included in one tract beginning at a Berch tree by Neshaminah Creek at the Corner of John Cowgills land. Thence Extending East ten degrees North by the lands of the said John Cowgill and John Croesdall and Jonathan Scaife Nine hundred and eighty eight perches to a forked Maple tree Thence South by east one hundred and eight perches to a post then East ten degrees North thirty Seven perches to a white oak The two lines last mentioned Running by James Suttons land Then South by East thirty two perches to a white oak Then by the line of Richard Lundy's land West ten degrees South Eight hundred and fifteen perches to a post by Neshaminah Creek Thence up the said Creek on the several Courses thereof two hundred and Nineteen Perches to the _____
