


Pennsylvania



William Penn Absolute Proprietary and
Governr. in Chief of the Province of Pensil-
vania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Richard Hough That I would grant him to take up a vacant piece of Land, Situate in the County of Bucks, between the Lands of Robert Lucas and William Peaks and William Venables, containing about three Hundred Acres more or less. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey on cause to be Survey'd unto him the said Tract. and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 30th. day of the ninth Month, 1700.
