

By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing Date the 25th. of the 3^d. Month Anno Domini, 1725 for Surveying to Morris Morris five hundred acres of Land the Original Purchase made of the late Proprietor by John Clare of Froom Selwood in the County of Somerset in Great Britain with the Right whereof the said Morris is now invested.
 This may certifie^{that on}, the 23^d. day of the 9th. Month in the same year, 1725 there was Surveyd to the said Morris in Part of the said five hundred acres a certain Tract or parcel of Land on the Back side of the Great Swamp in the County of Bucks. One other Tract of land situate in the Great Swamp in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a white Oak in a Line of Joseph Growdon's Land fifty two perches from Thomas Greasly's Corner Thence East by the said Growdon's Line One hundred and six perches to a post. Then by a line of Marked trees South One hundred and sixty perches to a white Oak. Then West by a Line of Marked trees. One hundred and six perches to a post. Then North by vacant Land One hundred and sixty perches to the place of Beginning. Containing One hundred acres with six acres added.
