


Whereas the Proprietor by his warrant dated the 26<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1683 granted to John Russel a lot to be survey'd to him in Philadelphia in proportion to ~~the~~ two hundred and fifty acres of land which lot as it appears by credible evidence was survey'd to the said John Russel soon after the grant of the said warrant on the south side of Sassafras street and on the east of the fourth street from Delaware.

Now this may certifie that by verbal order from the Secretary I have this 6-day of August laid out, de novo, the said lot of ~~the~~ ground bounded on the north with Sassafras street on the east with a lot now survey'd to Richard Townsend on the south with the ends of Mulberry street lots on the west with the fourth street from Delaware being in breadth forty nine foot and a half & in length two hundred fifty one foot.

The above lot is now in the possession of Joseph Mather who married the said John Russel's daughter
