At the request of John Morris, that we would grant
him to take up a third five hundred acres ^{of land} in part of tweh-
ty five hundred acres by him bought of Thomas ffairman
who purchased of Thomas Harley his right to five thousand
acres originally purchased of the Prop^t. These are to
require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd to
the sd Jn^o Morris ~~he~~ according to ye method of
townships the sd number of five hundred acres of land that
has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed
nor seated by the Indians, to be seated and improved
by the sd Jn^o Morris or his assigns within two years after
the date of survey otherwise the sd survey to be void and
of no other effect than if ye same had never been made
and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office.
