


Pennsylvania 55.



By the Commissioners of Proprietary.

Whereas the Proprietor by deeds dated the 21st & 22^d of December 1681 granted unto Gilbert Mace of London five hundred acres of land in this Province and the said Gilbert — by deeds dated 12th & 13th of May 1684 granted one moiety thereof to Jno^o Marlow who sold the same to Elizab^o Pace and afterwards the said Gilbert Mace by deeds dated ye 23^d & 24th of April 1711 granted ob^l. the other moiety of ye said 500 acres with all the rights & privileges thereunto belonging to th ob^l. Jno^o Marlow, at whose request by his Attorney Jno^o Estaugh, that we would grant him to take up ob^l. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Jno^o Marlow according to the method of townships appointed the said ^{moyety or} quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad^e the 12th of the first Month 171 $\frac{2}{3}$
