



Pursuant to 2 warrs from Edward Penington then Survey^r General directed unto me the one bearing date ye 7th ~~Sept 1701~~ and ye other ye 9th day of the 8 mo. 1701. I do certifie that I have surveyd the 24th day of ye ~~23~~ mo. 1703, unto Harriet Musgrave ^{now Price} a certaine parcel of land within ye liberty of ye Citty of Philadelphia on^e the west sid^e of Scoolekeel begining at a stak-~~ee~~ set in ye ground being a corner belonging to William Bedward from thence south south east 20 perches to another stak-thence-by a line of trees west 13 degrees south 164 perches to a gum being a corner of William Robarts land thence-by said land west south west 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ perch-to a stak-set in said Robarts line thence-by Daniel Thomas land north north west 20 perches to a stak-set in ye ground in Thomas Rees line thence-by ditto east northeast 49 perches to another stak-set in ye ground ~~ee~~ being a corner of sd. Thos Rees land thence-by a line of marked trees north north west 10 perches to corner of David Rees land thence-by ditto east northeast 123 perches ~~beginning~~ to a stak-being a corner of ye said William Bedwards land from thence-by the same south south east 47 perches to a blak-oke marked thence-west south west 8 perches to ye plac^e of begining containing 42 acres of land and is according to ye bounds above described returned into ye Generall Survey^r offic^e at Philadelphia ye 10th day of 6th mo. 1703
