

By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietary and Governor's bearing date the 9th day of the 8th month 1701 to survey unto Jonathan Wynn hundred acres of the land he is now seated on upon the west side of Schuykill beginning at Clark Jones his corner tree and to survey the remainder of the adjacent vacant land together with fifty acres adjoyning unto Edward Jones.

There was surveyd unto the said Edward Jones the 8th of October 1701 a tract of land on the west side of Schuykill in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a post at a corner of William Bedwards thence west south west by the said Bedwards line fifty perches to a post then by David Jones land south south east eighty two perches to a post then by Edward Roberts land oblique one hundred and eighteen perches to a post then north north west to a post fifty seven perches then west north west eight perches to a post then north sixteen degrees east sixty perches to a post then east south east thirty perches to a post the four lines last mentioned by the land of the said Edward Roberts then north eleven degrees west one hundred and seventeen perches to a post then west south west by the land of Griffith John one hundred and fifty four perches to a post then by the said William Bedwards land south south east one hundred and fifteen perches and a half to the place of the beginning, containing one hundred and sixty one acres.
