By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Elizabeth Wartnaby that we would grant her to take up one thousand acres of land in the County of Chester (for and on behalf of some of her relations and friends whom she expects in some short time from Great Britain) for which she agrees to pay to the Proprietors use one hundred pounds for the whole & the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for every hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Elizabeth Wartnaby within the said County of Chester according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of one thousand acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a return thereof into the Secretary's office which survey in case the said Elizabeth \_\_\_\_\_ or her relations fulfill the above agreement within one year after location together with nine months interest on the whole shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 28<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>nd</sup> mo. Anno Dni 1715.
