

By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the  
3d of the first month 1715/6 there was surveyed for Richard Jones of Perkeso-  
mink in the County of Philadelphia a tract of land joining to his own  
settlement beginning at a white oak at a corner of Edward Roberts land  
in a line of the London Comp<sup>ny's</sup> land thence south east by the said  
line sixty seven per<sup>s</sup> to corner hickory then by the lands of John  
Redwiser widow Caselberry and Stephen Bowyer north east ~~four~~ hun-  
dred <sup>ninty</sup> five perches to a corner stone then north west by John Bull's  
land seventy two perches to a white oak then by the land late of Andrew  
Scrammer and by the lands of the said Richard Jones Thomas Lock  
and the said Edward Roberts south west four hundred ninty five perches  
to the place of beginning containing two hundred and ~~one~~ three acres  
with six ff cent surveyed the 20<sup>th</sup> of August 1730 by
