


Pennsylvania 55



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of James Tregan of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up two hundred and fifty acres of land in the said County for which he hath agreed to pay to the Proprietors use five and twenty pounds with the usual yearly Quitt-rent of one shilling sterling per hundred. These are oblige authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said James Tregan according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of land in yerb. said County of Chester that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians, and make return thereof into the Secretaries office which survey, in case the said James — fulfill the said agreem't within three month after location shall be valid, otherwise the same ~~shall~~ be void and of no effect as if it had never been made nor this warrt ever granted. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad'lia the 23<sup>d</sup> day of the first month A.D. 171 $\frac{3}{4}$ .
