

William Penn, Proprietary and Governor of the Province of Pennsylvania &c. Whereas divers considerable persons among the Welsh friends have requested me that all the land purchased of obliterated fabl' abl. together with ye obliterated hem as Haverfordshire in obliterated obliterated Barony alledging that the number already obliterated come are such as will abl. capable of planting the same much within the proportionabl allo wed by the custom of the country and so not ly in lazy and useless vacancies and because I am inclined & determined to agree and fauour them with any reasonable convenience and priviledge I do hereby charge thee and strictly require thee to lay out the said tract of land in as uniform a manner as conveniently may be upon the west side of Shookil river running three miles upon ye same and two miles backward then extend the parallel line wth the river six miles and to runn westwardly so far as till the said quantity of land be compleatly surveyed unto them. Given at Penbury the 13th day of the first month 1684
