


Pensylvania 5s.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Rees Thomas and Anthony Morris, that we would grant them to take up the quantity of six hundred twenty five acres of land belonging to them in right of Humphry South's original purchase of one thousand acres made of the late Propriet^t, and also the quantity of two hundred thirty seven acres which were wanting in the tract of two thousand acres lately confirm'd to them in Chester County in right of Joseph Moor John Moor and Sabian Cole their originall purchase made of the said Proprietary. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Rees Thomas and Anthony Morris according to ye method of townships the said two quantities of land which together make eight hundred sixty two acres that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns there of into the Secretary's office. Given under our hands and ye lesser seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 8th day of 9^br Anno D^rhi 1727. Richd. Hill
