

Whereas the Commissioners of Property by their warrant dated the 7th day of the 4th month ANNO — 1716 required me to survey or cause to be survey'd unto Israel Taylor & Joseph Taylor sons of Christopher Taylor one thousand acres of land within this Province and whereas the said Israel and Joseph — requested an addition of three hundred acres to be purchased of the said Commissioners. This may certifie that on the 14th day of May 1719 there was survey'd and laid out for the said Israel and Joseph — a tract of ~~one thousand~~ acres land containing one thousand ⁱⁿ the township of Strasburg in the County of Chester which tract was on the 20th of June 1720 enlarged to the quantity one thousand and three hundred acres beginning at a marked black oak in a line of Martin Kendrick's land thence East by North by the land late of Joseph English and by the land of Philip fferee and Daniel fferee five hundred twenty seven perches to a black walnut tree thence South by East by the lands of Harman Richman and Henry Wauger four hundred forty two perches ~~to~~ to a hickory tree then West by South four hundred fifty two perches to a white oak by Little Beaver Creek then West North West ninety perches to a post then North by West by the said Martin Kendrick's land three hundred seventy two perches to the place of beginning.
