


Pennsylvania 55.



By the Commissioners of Property

Whereas in or about the year of our Lord 168—There was survey'd unto John Moor Sabian Cole and Company a certain tract of land in the County of Chester which was intended for two thousand acres, but part thereof was erregularly laid out within the lines of the tract of forty thousand acres granted together to the Welch original purchasers, which said part was therefore cut off from the rest and confirmed to such of the said Welch purchasers as had a right to the same and the remainder lies in one tract contiguous to the lines of the Welch tract aforesaid and the right of the same appears now to be vested in Rees Thomas and Anthony Morris Jun^r. Who requesting a resurvey of the same as also an order to take up the residue thereof to compleat the said quantity of two thousand acres. These therefore are to authorize & require thee to resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd unto the said Rees Thomas & Anthony Morris the said tract of land according to ye present lines thereof and lay out in some vacant place of the Province so much land as will compleat the said two thousand acres and make exact returns of the same into the Secretary's office in order for a further confirmation.
